CONTINUE TO REHEARSE SONGS AND MONOLOGUES

- GATHER AN OUTFIT YOU LOVE THAT YOU LOOK AND FEEL GOOD IN. SOMETHING YOU'D WEAR ON A FIRST DATE.
- MAKE A SHOT LIST OF WHICH PIECES YOU WANT TO FILM CLOSE UP AND WHICH FULL BODY. NOTE ANY SCHOOLS THAT ASK FOR RECORDED INTERVIEW QUESTIONS OR A DIFFERENT STYLE SHOT.

- GATHER AN OUTFIT YOU LOVE THAT YOU LOOK AND FEEL GOOD IN. SOMETHING YOU'D WEAR ON A FIRST DATE.
- MAKE A SHOT LIST OF WHICH PIECES YOU WANT TO SUBMIT TO WHICH SCHOOLS, WHAT SHOT YOU NEED AND WHETHER YOU NEED TO SLATE.

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NOTE ANY SCHOOLS THAT ASK FOR RECORDED INTERVIEW QUESTIONS AND THINK ON THOSE.
